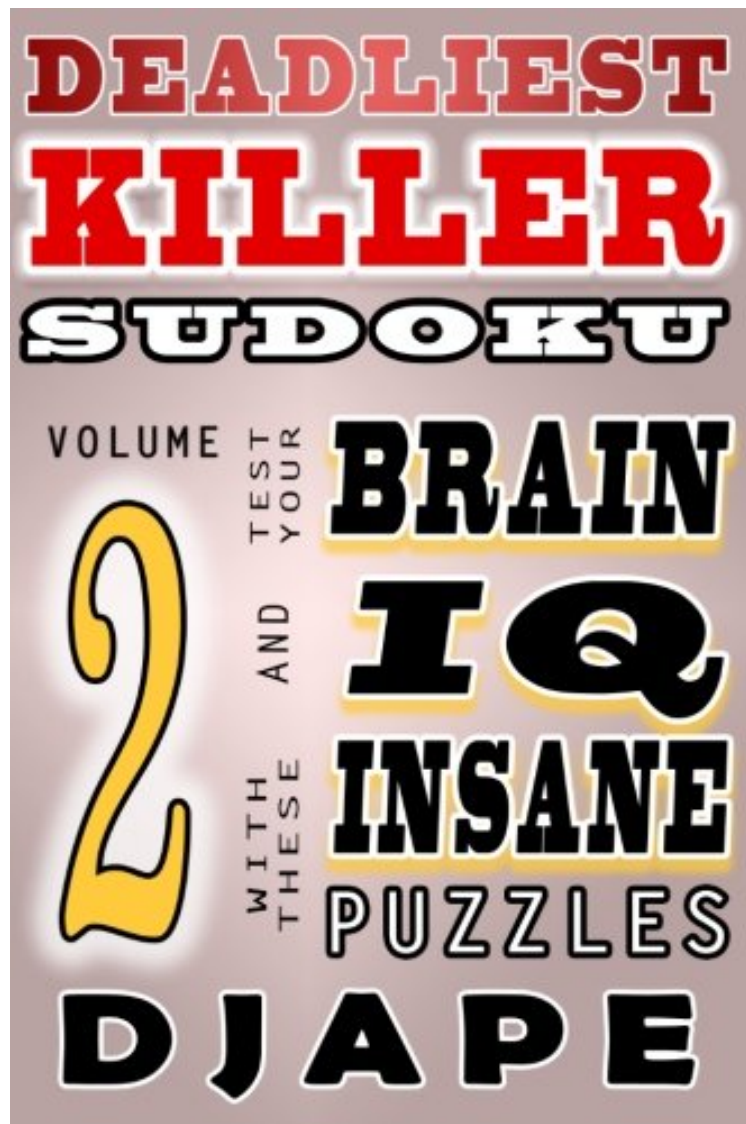

At first look they seemed easy, then the complication set in, and process of elimination and deduction were required to solve them. I am very glad they are not too easy. Too many machine generated killer sudoku books out there, Djape's is the only one that any real thought went into designing them. It's great to find a killer sudoku book where all of the puzzles are challenging. Really worth the price, as I don't have to skip all of the easy ones. I found the "insane" puzzles easier than the "IQ" ones, though. Does that mean what I think it means? Anyway, enjoy the book. I still have 1 puzzle to complete, and maybe 3 to go back to that I gave up on before. I'm not giving up!

Due to popular demand, having published numerous books with Killer Sudoku puzzles which contained puzzles of all difficulties, Djape has decided to publish a book only with the toughest and deadliest Killers. This is volume 2 of the series. By no means is this a book for a novice Killer Sudoku solver. It is intended only for the most experienced and most persistent of those who are already masters at solving Sudokus with sums. It contains only puzzles of the 3 hardest levels of difficulty which Djape produces: BRAIN, IQ and INSANE, with addition of a few puzzles of an even more fiendish kind - Zero Killer Sudokus. 40 BRAIN (5 diagonal) 50 IQ! (5 diagonal) 10 ZERO (including 5 ZERO INSANE) 11 totally INSANE! For a total of 111 most difficult Killer Sudoku puzzles So... are you up for this challenge?
