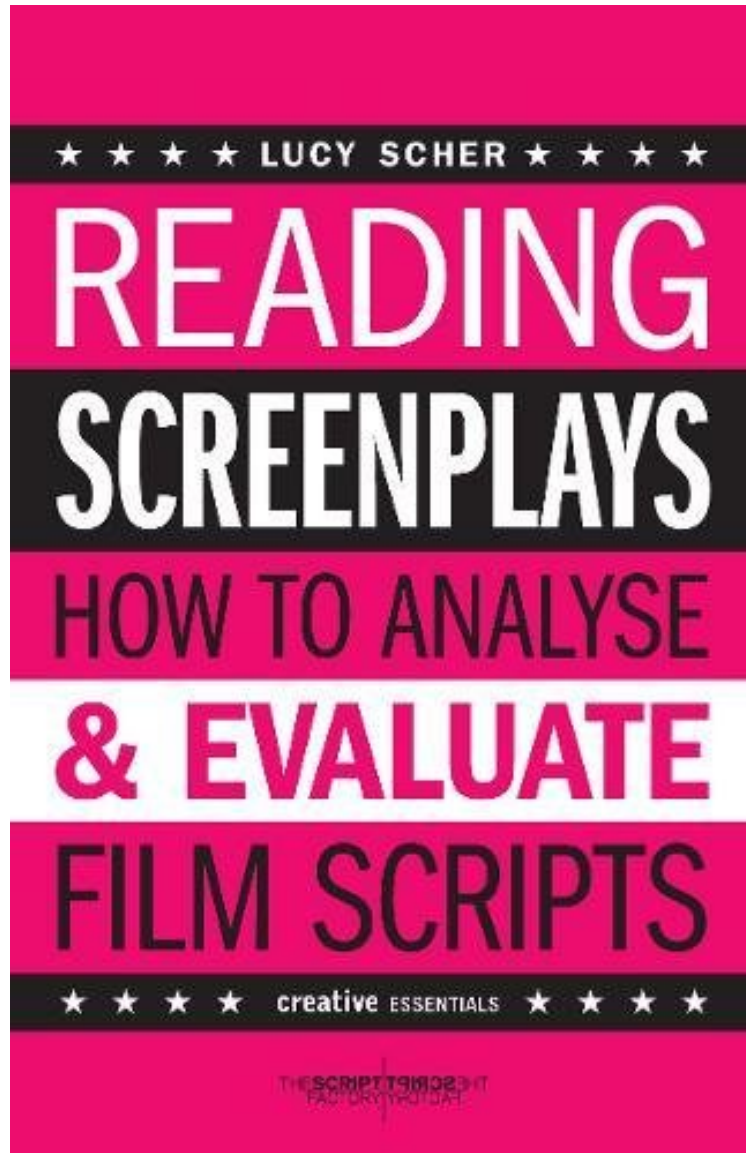

I found the book informative and it comes up with some good points on steps in the screenwriting development process. It's good to know that the people who are reading scripts for production companies, film funds and TV networks are getting a proper knowledge of how a script works and is written, but I must say that I'm a little bit worried that all the standards and formulas that the book presents might make it harder for original stories to find production in the future.
