Stacy Keach, Sr. created the show and based it on actual Texas Ranger cases. The show was unique in that it had one foot in the western genre and the other in the crime genre. It proved an unbeatable and very entertaining combination.When Keach created the show only about 50 Texas Rangers remained to cover those 260,000 square miles where anything could happen. Nearly 100 shows were produced over the two year period it was on NBC and about 1/5 of those were based on the actual experiences of the show's advisor, Captain M.T. Gonzauillas. He had traveled those dusty and dangerous miles of lonesome and had reportedly had to fire on and kill over 30 men in the course of his career. It somehow lended an air of authenticity to the show.Tales of the Texas Rangers was terrific and I cannot recommend it highly enough to fans of old radio. While not every case was complex, there was lots of Texas atmosphere for fans to enjoy. There was action and drama, and McCrea's fine performance you could always hang your hat on. Eighteen episodes of Tales of the Texas Rangers, a Western old-time radio police procedural drama which originally aired on NBC Radio from 1951 to 1952. With the episodes created and produced by Stacy Keach Sr., the series focused on fictitious Texas Ranger Jace Pearson - played by film star Joel McCrea - who uses the latest scientific techniques to identify criminals. His faithful horse, Charcoal (or 'Charky'), helps Pearson to track down the culprits. The radio shows are reenactments of actual Texas Ranger cases, and feature an outstanding supporting cast that included Tony Barrett, William Johnstone, Virginia Gregg and narrator Hal Gibney.
